INSTRUCTIONS FOR PATIENTS

Please consult with your physician for questions regarding your prescription medication. If you have any questions about procedure preparations please call 860-585-3020.

CT SCAN

Abdomen

*Nothing to eat or drink <u>4</u> hours before your exam. *Patient will be required to pick up a special drink in CT area. *This drink must be taken <u>1</u> hr before your scheduled exam.

Abdomen & Pelvis

*Nothing to eat or drink <u>4</u> hours before your exam.

*Patient will be required to pick up a special drink in CT area. *These drinks must be taken $\underline{1} \& \underline{2}$ hrs before your exam.

Abdomen & Pelvis for Kidney Stones or Hernia

-No Prep-No Drinks

Chest, Head, Soft Tissue Neck

*Nothing to eat or drink <u>4 hours</u> before your exam.

$\textbf{Chest for nodule}\text{-}No \ prep$

Pelvis

*Nothing to eat or drink <u>4 hours</u> before your exam. *Patient will be required to pick up a special drink in the CT department.

*This drink must be taken <u>2</u> hrs before your scheduled exam. **Spine & Sinuses – No Prep**

CARDIO-PULMONARY

Stress Tests

- *Nothing to eat or drink <u>4 hours</u> before your exam.
- *Wear comfortable clothes & sneakers.

*Check with MD about your medications.

*Stress Testing may be combined with a perfusion scan in Nuclear Medicine.

Pulmonary Function Test

*No bronchodilators or smoking $\underline{4}$ hrs before exam.

Echo, EKG, Holtor Monitor-No Prep

<u>NUCLEAR MEDICINE</u> CARDIOLITE/LEXISCAN STRESS TEST

*1 DAY PROTOCOL- expect to be here for 5 hrs.**

*Nothing to eat or drink <u>4</u> hours before your exam. *No caffeine or smoking the morning of the exam. *Check with your MD about medications.

Gastric Emptying

*Nothing to eat or drink after midnight.

*No stomach medications $\underline{2}$ days prior.

*No all ergies to Eggs or Eggs Beaters $\ensuremath{\mathbb{R}}$ /notify department if gluten free diet is needed.

HIDA Scan

*Nothing to eat or drink <u>4</u> hours before your exam. *No Opiates for 4 hrs, before your exam.

Thyroid Scan and Uptake, Parathyroid Scan

*Patient must be off thyroid medication <u>1</u> week prior. *Nothing to eat or drink after midnight *No IV contrast within last 30 days.

VQ Lung Scan

*Chest x-ray required <u>24 hours prior to this exam</u>. Bone Scan, MUGA, White Blood Cell Study – No Prep

PET SCAN

*Diabetic patients –Diagnostic RN will contact you

*Nothing to eat or drink min 4 hrs before your appointment.

*Do not wear any metal (zippers, jewelry etc).

*Avoid vigorous exercise 24 hrs prior to scan.

<u>MAMMOGRAPHY</u> No deodorant/powder prior to exam. No breastfeeding for 6 months prior to exam. Bring films/disk to exam if done at other facility.

Breast Biopsy

*Off blood thinners, aspirin, & aspirin-like products for 5 days prior to procedure.

RADIOLOGY

Upper GI, Small Bowel, IVP, Barium Swallow *Nothing to eat or drink after midnight. *Small bowel series may take up to 6 hours.

Modified Barium Swallow with speech -NO Prep Barium Enema

*Obtain Magnesium Citrate & Dulcolax *Follow prep sheet from MD. *Nothing to eat or drink after midnight. Bone Density Scan

*No calcium medication within 24 hrs *No Barium within 2 weeks

MRI/MRA

*All MRI patients will change into hospital clothes.
*No jewelry/watches, No medication patches.
*Safety questions will be reviewed by the MRI department.
Abdominal & MRCP
*Nothing to eat or drink <u>4</u> hours before your exam.

EEG

- *Clean hair
- * No caffeine.
- $^{*}\mbox{If}$ questioning seizure activity no more than 5hrs of sleep.

ULTRASOUND

Abdomen, Liver, Gallbladder, Pancreas, Spleen, Aorta *Nothing to eat or drink 6 hours before your exam.

Breast, Thyroid, Carotid, Legs, Extremities, Spleen *No Prep

Pelvic, Renal, Pregnancy

*Starting $\underline{1}$ hour before your exam, drink 32oz of water within 15 mins.

*Your bladder must be full.

*Do not empty your bladder until the exam is completed.

Pregnancy (20 weeks and under)

*Starting <u>1</u> hour before your exam, drink 32oz of water within 15 mins.

*Your bladder must be full.

*Do not empty your bladder until the exam is completed.

BUN/Creatinine levels are required on the following patients prior to the administration of Contrast:

*Age 60 or above *Diabetic *Gout/Hyperuricemia *Hypertension *Pre-existing kidney disease or surgery

Some diabetic patients, who take Metformin and receive IV contrast, will be given specific post contrast instructions.
